Message from new Senior Teacher




Hello, my name is Josie Davenport and I am very excited to be joining Antingham and Southrepps in September.

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Penalty Notice Fines for School Attendance are changing!

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued **after 19th August 2024**.

Per Parent, Per Child

Penalty Notice Fines are issued to each parent, for each child that was absent. For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines.

National Threshold

There will be a single consistent national threshold for when a penalty notice must be considered by all schools in England of 10 sessions (usually equivalent to 5 school days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10 school week period. These sessions do not have to be consecutive and can be made up of a combination of any type of unauthorised absence.

The 10-school week period can span different terms or school years.

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be: • £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

Second Offence (within 3 years)

- The Second time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be:
- £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)

- The third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrate's Court. Prosecution can result in criminal records and fines of up to £2,500.
- Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.

If you think you may be eligible we would encourage you to apply as soon as possible.



School Meals

Just a reminder to parents whose children are moving up from Year 2 into Year 3 – your child will no longer be eligible for Universal Free School Meals and therefore any lunches ordered will be charged at a cost of ± 2.45 per meal.



What have we been learning?

Frida Kahlo Class - This term has been very busy with trips, settling in sessions with our new children and finishing up our maths and English. It is always exciting to reach the end of the year but also sad to say goodbye to our Reception children and wish them luck for year 1. The children have loved taking part in all of our lessons, especially English. We have been reading Supertato and reading a page each day to find out what happened. Reception have completed some amazing pieces of writing and Nursery have drawn some great pictures of Supertato.

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In maths, we have been recapping over everything we have learnt this year. This included repeating patterns, problem solving, adding and taking away and doubling.



The children were given the challenge of making a repeating pattern and then describing it to their partner.

The children needed to use their problem solving and thinking skills with each other to work out how to get across the crocodile infested pond.



We have been exploring beach life and looking at animals that live in the sea. The children have learnt about the different animals that live in shells and where they can be found.



In bushcraft, we recently read then Gruffalo story and the children loved making a cave to hide in from the Gruffalo. The children have all taken part in using bow and arrows, axes, saw and have showed good listening to make sure they stay safe.

This year Mrs Smith, Mrs Mattews and I have enjoyed working with the children and seeing them all grow in confidence and independence.

Stephen Hawking Class - Coming to the end of the summer term and the year, we are very proud of how much the children in Stephen Hawking class have learned and discovered. It has been a busy and full-on year with lots of trips and exciting learning opportunities. We took a trip to experience a medieval castle, a wildlife reserve and The Royal Norfolk Show. This term has also included sports day, where we were able to experience a range of different activities and put our sports skills to the test!

We have been continuing with our 'Magnificent Monarchs' topic and have now covered monarchs from Alfred the Great in 871 all the way up to the current monarch King Charles III and his mother Queen Elizabeth II. We have looked deeper into the lives of six key monarchs and how their reigns impacted the lives of people in Britain. As a nice link to our art lessons, about portraits, we used the computers to turn ourselves into monarchs and create some royal portraits!





In this last half term, we have been enjoying a range of new bushcraft lessons including: tree identification, making soap from silver birch leaves and preparing wood for an end of year campfire in the woods!





Thank you all for making this a brilliant and fun-filled year in Stephen Hawking class! We hope that you all have a fantastic summer holiday and come back rested and ready for another year of learning.

Nick Vujicic Class - As we reach the end of the year, it is lovely to look back at so many memories.

In maths, Year 6 had deepened their understanding of the topics covered through the year, while Year 5 finished their numbers learning, with decimals, fractions, percentages, using number lines and finding different ways to answer problems. Year 4 covered money, decimals, fractions and statistics.

In science, we finished exploring reversible and irreversible mixtures.

In RE, we finished Hinduism, with the best class discussions we ever had.

We covered the Ancient Greeks in History and Geography, connecting our learning to an amazing trip to the Norwich Castle.

That was not our only trip this term. We had the opportunity to visit the Watatunga reserve and all their incredible work with species of deer and antelopes from around the world. We had our annual visit to the Norfolk show and they were super starts. Year 6 children had their special trip to Norwich for a tubing session, where they left with the biggest smiles I have seen this year.

This term, we had the privilege to visit Gresham's prep school in Holt on several occasions, where the children had the opportunity to take part in lessons in drama, music (learning all about samba percussions) and wall climbing.
